EMPOWERING YOUNG WORKERS FOR THE FUTURE




EMPOWERING FUTURE PUBLIC LEADERS

In his engaging and thought-provoking session, Mr Sanjeev equipped participants with a solid understanding of employment rights, workplace fairness, salary and working hours, leave entitlements, and CPF contributions. He also addressed real challenges young workers may face, such as harassment, unfair treatment, and overwhelming workloads – issues that can feel daunting without the right support. Andiappan — Growing with Purpose, Learning with Passion

For more than two decades, Andiappan has been a steady, committed presence in NParks—steadfast, dependable, and deeply rooted in his purpose. And even now, in the final year of his re-employment, he continues to bloom in new ways, embodying the spirit of relevance, resilience, and readiness. His journey is a testament to what it truly means to be a Transformation Champion.

When many might have slowed down, Andiappan chose a different path: he stepped forward, stepped up, and stepped into the unknown. Taking on a new role, he embraced unfamiliar technologies with the curiosity of a beginner and the determination of a seasoned professional. The world of indoor, vertical hydroponics—once completely foreign—soon became a space where he thrived. He learned the science behind nutrient mixes, lighting, and modern planting systems, mastering techniques that kept him agile in an industry rapidly transforming around him.

Every new skill became a seed of confidence. Every challenge, an opportunity to grow.

One of his greatest hurdles came in plant identification, where limited resources and subtle differences between cultivars often made the task feel overwhelming. Yet instead of stepping back, he built his own pathway forward. He developed a meticulous, self-taught system—cross-referencing online databases, consulting plant books, and even going the extra mile to send specimens to the herbarium. What once felt daunting soon became an area of strength, sharpening his expertise and reinforcing his role as a trusted resource in the team.

But Andiappan's transformation is not defined by knowledge alone—it is the impact of that knowledge that truly sets him apart. His refined skills in identifying plant cultivars, such as Plumerias, helped accelerate plant issuance processes, increasing efficiency for the entire operations team. He embraced tools like email coordination and Excel spreadsheets to communicate more clearly and effectively with NParks colleagues, bridging operational gaps and strengthening teamwork.

And when asked to share at the Hort Colloquium, he took the stage not just to present information but to inspire understanding—elevating awareness and learning within the NParks community.

Behind all of this is a simple, powerful truth: Andiappan loves what he does. Working with plants gives him joy, purpose, and a sense of contribution that fuels his pursuit of excellence. His passion makes learning feel natural. It keeps him forward-looking, purposeful, and engaged driving him not just to keep up with change, but to embrace it wholeheartedly. Being recognised as a Transformation Champion is a proud and meaningful milestone for him. It affirms the value of his journey, honours the impact he has created over two decades, and reflects his gratitude for AUPE's support in helping him grow and thrive. To him, the recognition is not just an award—it is a reminder that adaptability, curiosity, and a willingness to evolve can spark meaningful change, both for oneself and for others. And to younger professionals just beginning their journey, he offers a piece of heartfelt advice: Be curious. Be brave. Keep learning.

From Dedication to Innovation: The Remarkable Journey of Aminurashid Bin Eksan

With over 26 years of dedicated service at the National Parks Board (NParks), Aminurashid Bin Eksan, Manager, has built a career defined by commitment, adaptability, and an unwavering drive to uplift the people and places under his care. Overseeing operations, facilities, customer feedback and parks management, he has long been a steady force within his team – and today, he stands out as a true AUPE Transformation Champion.

The Transformation Champion Award recognises members who embrace change, anticipate challenges, and strengthen their workplaces through innovation and resilience. Aminurashid has embodied this spirit throughout his career, consistently seeking ways to improve processes, support colleagues, and raise professional standards across his division. A key part of his recent growth has been mastering NParks' system applications, including platforms such as MaVen2 and WorkDay. By embedding these tools seamlessly into daily operations, he improved accuracy in feedback and work order management, streamlined safety workflows, and enhanced communication with colleagues. These improvements have raised maintenance standards and boosted confidence across the teams he supports, reinforcing his role as a dependable and forward-thinking leader.

The journey, however, was not without its challenges. Integrating new systems into established processes required persistence and renewed technical knowledge. To overcome these hurdles, he invested in his professional development by completing the Certified Park Manager (CPM) and Certified Playground Inspector (CPSI) courses. These qualifications strengthened his understanding of safety frameworks and operational excellence, enabling him to conduct root cause analysis and collaborate proactively with his Reporting Officer to improve workflows. When choosing what skills to develop, he focuses on areas that directly support operational excellence and organisational priorities. Whether enhancing safety processes or improving

team communication, he ensures each new skill brings practical benefits to his colleagues and the wider NParks community. His adaptability extends across a wide range of duties – from Tree Inspections, Playground Equipment Checks, Enforcement, and Habitat Enhancement Planting, to community initiatives like Therapeutic Garden programmes, Allotment Garden management, Dog run area upkeep, and volunteering at major NParks events, including HortFestival@HortPark and LightFestival@JLG. His contributions reflect both technical proficiency and a strong sense of service.

Learning remains a continuous motivator for him. Seeing the impact of improved workflows, clearer communication, and strengthened safety standards inspires him to keep growing, especially in an environment where operational demands and public expectations evolve rapidly.

Being recognised as an AUPE Transformation Champion is both an honour and a meaningful milestone. It affirms his commitment to resilience, adaptability, and supporting others on their transformation journeys. To him, it is also a reminder of how small, consistent improvements can create lasting positive change.

His encouragement to others is clear: embrace new skills with an open mind. Every learning opportunity, he believes, helps individuals collaborate better, stay relevant, and drive meaningful progress. Stepping beyond one's comfort zone, he is what turns challenges into achievements – and individuals into champions of transformation.

Transforming Workplaces Through Learning and Leadership

Muhd Asyraf Bin Rasack, who has served in the Public Service for 15 years, has been nominated as an AUPE Transformation Champion. With a career grounded in Laboratory Operations, Safety Management, and Animal Care, he brings strong competencies in Workplace Safety and Health (WSH), laboratory management, and leading small teams.

Asyraf's nomination reflects his continued commitment to learning and improvement. Through his BSc in Workplace Safety and Health at SUSS, he recently deepened his knowledge in human-factors analysis, risk communication, and behaviour-based safety. These skills have enabled him to identify hidden risks, streamline workflows, and communicate hazards more effectively, strengthening safety and team confidence.

Integrating new concepts into daily work came with challenges, especially when applying theoretical models such as HFACS and the Swiss Cheese Model. To support understanding among colleagues, Asyraf used simple visuals, real laboratory scenarios, and short walkabouts. This approach helped bridge gaps, build buy-in, and ensure the new knowledge supported routine operations.

When deciding what to learn next, Asyraf focuses on skills that enhance workplace safety, operational resilience, and worker well-being. He also considers how each skill can benefit others, from his immediate team to fellow union members

and the younger leaders he mentors in Young AUPE. By prioritising practical learning and sharing knowledge with colleagues, he strengthens both individual capability and team cohesion. One example of applying new knowledge was his use of human-factors principles to refine a laboratory workflow. By assessing task demands, potential error points, and environmental influences, he introduced layout and communication adjustments that reduced confusion, improved safety awareness, and minimised near-miss incidents—all while working within the existing system. Beyond his technical responsibilities, he contributes actively to the development of other union members and young leaders, helping them gain relevant skills to navigate evolving workplace demands.

His motivation stems from a learning mindset and a strong sense of responsibility for workplace safety. In a rapidly evolving WSH landscape, he aims to ensure frontline officers, lab teams, and union peers benefit from updated knowledge, recognising that each skill gained contributes to safer and more effective work.

Being featured as a Transformation Champion is, for Asyraf, both humbling and meaningful. It affirms his dedication to continuous learning and reinforces his role in promoting safer laboratory practices as a Senior Lab Technical Officer and nurturing young leaders as Deputy Head of Young AUPE. He views the recognition as a reminder to continue contributing and uplifting others.

To those considering their own development journey, his message is clear: start small, stay curious, and recognise that improvement is achievable at every level. Each new skill—whether in safety, digital tools, or communication—creates opportunities for growth and encourages others to grow as well. Asyraf's journey demonstrates that continual learning, practical application, and sharing expertise can meaningfully enhance both individual performance and the wider public service.

Celebrating Excellence: The G. Muthukumarasamy Award 2025

4) What are your future career goals, and how do you hope your education will help you achieve them?

I want to be a cybersecurity consultant or specialist so my current studies in SIT is directly helping me in achieving that. Right now, I am learning the basic essentials like programming and computer architecture that will be useful knowledge in my future career.

5) Is there a particular experience or mentor who has inspired you during your studies?

I think back to an industry sharing session when I was in polytechnic, where I learnt about how the concept of Singpass was made all the way back in 2006 and without it now, a number of government services would be all scattered in different websites or apps. I was really inspired by how a small idea now could create a meaningful change years later. It made me wonder what else IT could be used to improve people's lives.

6) What advice would you give to other students who are facing similar challenges?

As a student, I sometimes also have bad time management. However, I overcome them by having a schedule and a daily checklist. When I struggle to study or procrastinate, I go to the library surrounded by people also studying which would normally pressure me to do my work.

7) How has the support from AUPE impacted your confidence and outlook on your education?

The support has greatly improved my confidence in pursuing my studies. With some of the support going into my tuition fees, I feel relieved and can fully focus on my studies and future goals.

8) What message would you like to share with other recipients of the study grants like yourself?

I would like to say congratulations to all my fellow grant recipients! I know how much hard work and perseverance it took to get here. Wishing you all the best in your studies and future endeavors!

1) Can you tell us a bit about yourself and your educational journey so far?

Hi, my name is Angirena, and I am currently an SIT student pursuing a four-year Engineering degree in Information Security. My interest in ICT began as early as primary school, when I joined my school's robotics CCA. In secondary school, I also joined the robotics club, which I enjoyed, but I struggled to balance it with my academics. I found it difficult to study and excel in eight different subjects, especially those I had less interest in. After my O-Levels, I decided not to pursue the JC route and instead enrolled in a Diploma in Cybersecurity at Nanyang Polytechnic, which aligned more closely with my interests. Although the learning style in polytechnic was very different, I found it fulfilling due to the hands-on approach and emphasis on self-learning. I discovered the depth and diversity of the cybersecurity field, which motivated me to further my studies at SIT, where I am now.

2) What does receiving the AUPE study grant and being nominated for the G Muthukumarasamy Award mean to you personally and academically?

I am very happy to receive the award as it serves as a recognition of all the hard work and dedication I put in for the past few years. It motivates me to excel in my studies

3) How do you stay motivated to pursue your studies despite obstacles?

For me, I enjoy my studies which in turn drives my motivation. I think having a plan also helps in tackling obstacles as you have time to ask for help from friends or teachers, instead of rushing through in like a week or a day.

4) What are your future career goals, and how do you hope your education will help you achieve them?

I'm mainly interested in urban planning and environmental impact assessment, aiming to work in organisations that make cities greener and more sustainable. My Environmental Studies education equips me to develop practical, eco-friendly solutions and contribute to policies that keep Singapore vibrant, green, and resilient for future generations.

5) Is there a particular experience or mentor who has inspired you during your studies?

8) What message would you like to share with other recipients of the study grants like yourself?

We've worked incredibly hard to reach this point and should be proud of how far we've come. This grant is more than financial support—it reminds us to keep striving, stay humble, and pay it forward as we continue learning, growing, and contributing to society.

1) Can you tell us a bit about yourself and your educational journey so far?

After my O Levels, I studied Landscape Design and Horticulture at Ngee Ann Polytechnic, which deepened my love for plants and the environment. This sparked my interest in broader environmental issues, leading me to pursue an undergraduate degree in Environmental Studies at NUS. The transition has been challenging but rewarding, thanks to the chance to learn and collaborate with dedicated peers.

2) What does receiving the AUPE study grant and being nominated for the G. Muthukumarasamy Award mean to you personally and academically?

Receiving this grant is incredibly meaningful. It eases my financial burden, especially with adult transport fares, and provides stability that allows me to focus on academic opportunities.
